Purpose of funding
To continue to increase the number of children taking part in competitive sport (Intra and inter competitions). To continue to support the least active children in our school to engage in physical activity. To improve resources to support the development of PE and enhance provision. To utilise sports external sports coaches to offer extra opportunities beyond the knowledge of teaching staff - Judo, Fencing, Gymnastics, Dance etc.

Nature of support 2016/17
School Sports Partnership with local high school and Vale Royal School Sports Partnership to provide greater access to staff training, links to competitions, enrichments and experience festivals and events to increase pupil participation. Wider range of after-school clubs and activities. Specialist sports coaching - judo, fencing, cricket, gymnastics etc. Development of staff skills and expertise to empower then ensure outstanding provision in PE across the school. We are now recognised as a Sainsbury's gold mark school.

Measuring the impact of PPSG spending
The school has met the criteria for the Sainsbury's School Games Gold Kitemark. 14 sports were represented at level 2 SSP cluster event (School Sports Partnership) competitions. This was a direct result of specific sport training from our SSCo and in house training sessions. The percentage of Key Stage 2 children participating in a team or individual Level 2 competition (interschool) was 22% . Training has been provided to staff in both Key Stages. The training has been used to implement C4L (Change4Life) club to target inactive children. Training for children to implement and lead sports/active clubs through Physkids in year 5, Sports Ambassadors and C4L champions. All Key Stage 2 pupils plus year 2 have participated in inter-school festivals and celebrations, including cross country and athletics. Whole School participation in one or more sports based after-school continued at 85% in Key Stage 2 and increased to 60% across the whole school, by the end of 2016/17. Our teams won Vale Royal winners for dodgeball, orienteering and runner up in hockey
